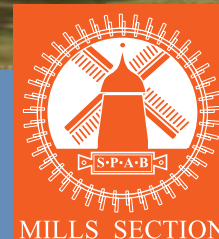
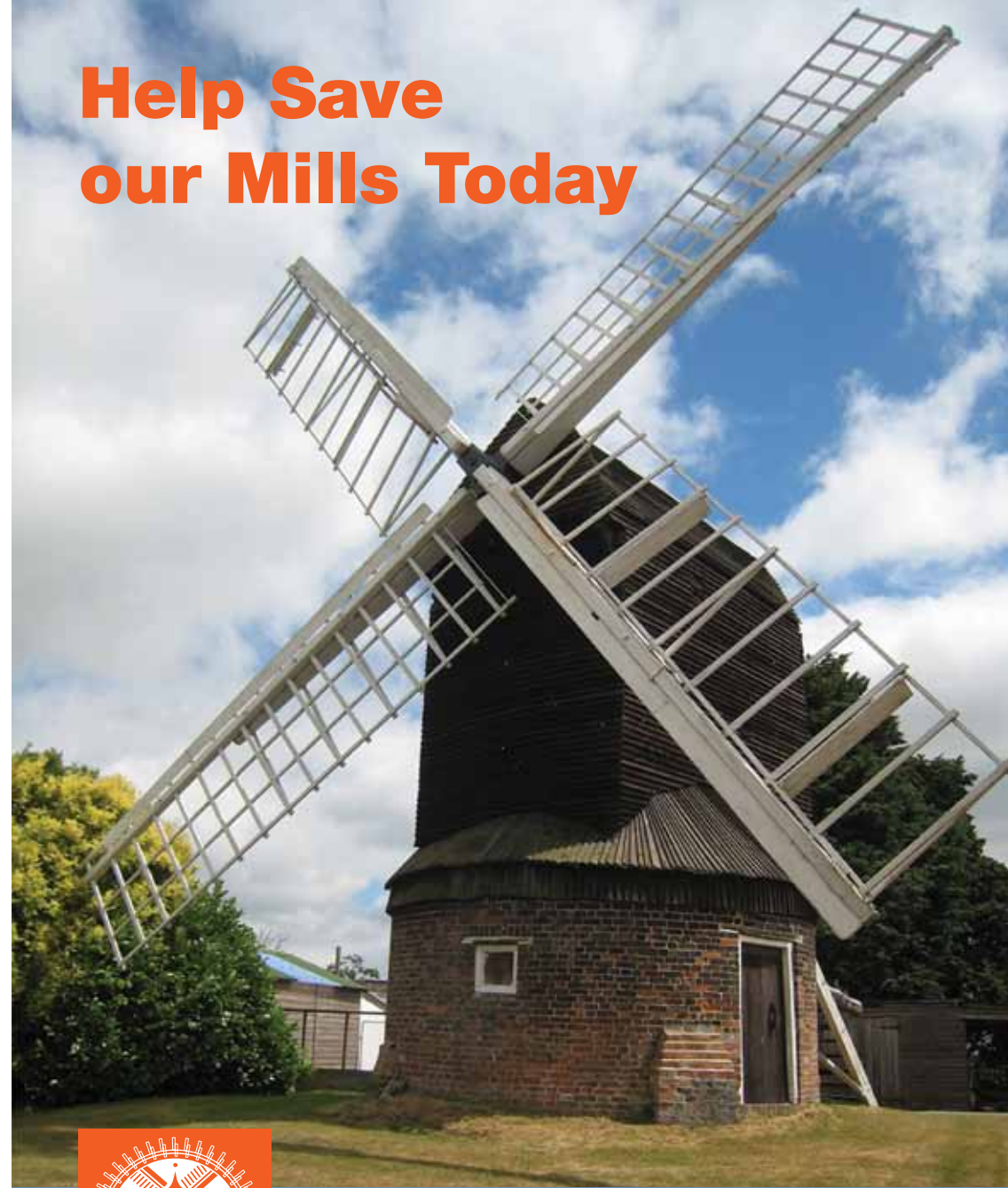

We have lost many of them through neglect or other reasons, so it is all the more important to save what we have left, whether they are working mills or just for visitors to look at.

Daniel’s Mill Bridgnorth Shropshire was helped from the fund when a landslide brought down the launder of the mill.

The few mills left are vulnerable structures, constantly needing work done on them, so please help us provide the funds for us to take practical steps to help them. Thank You.
